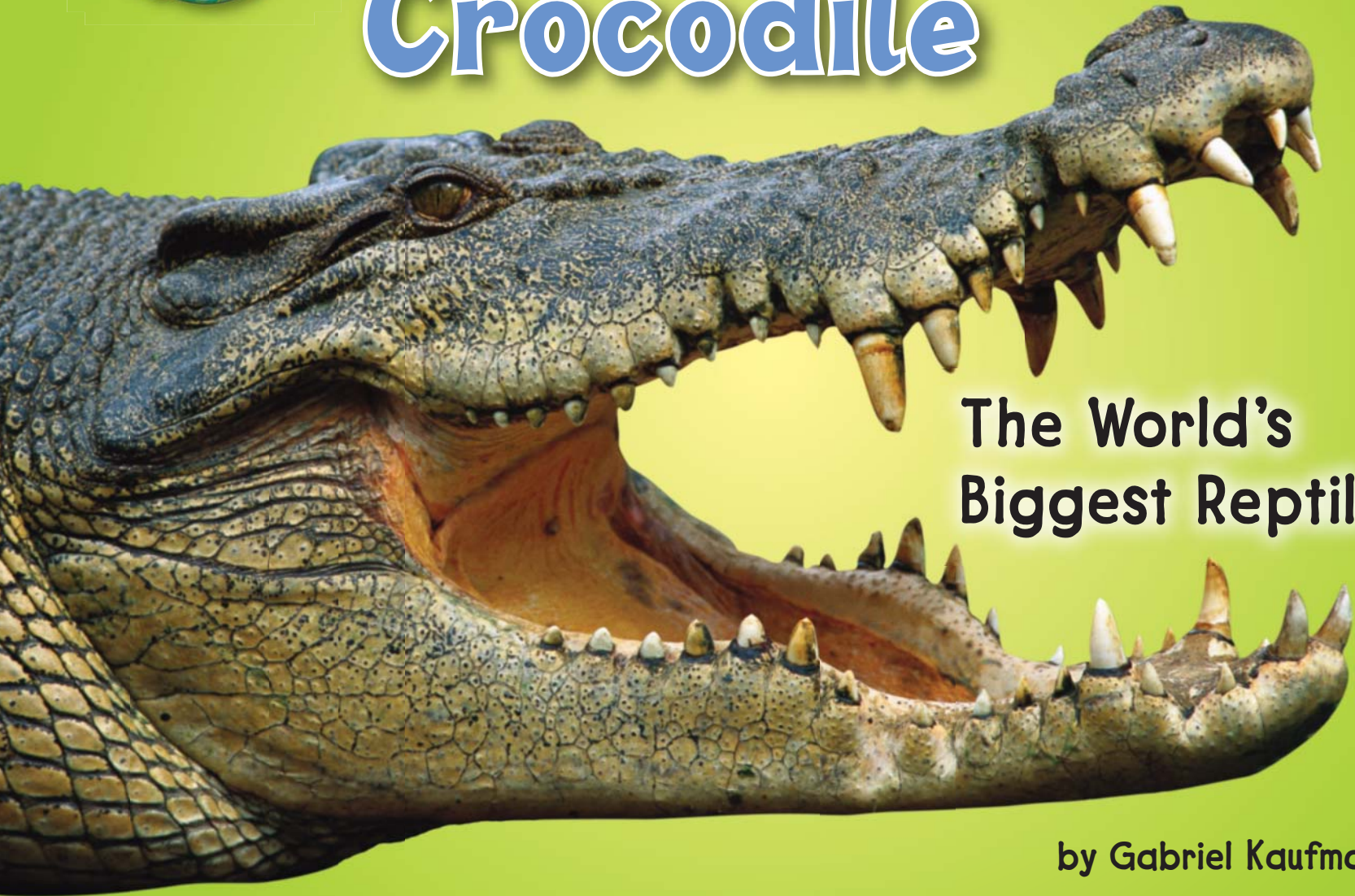

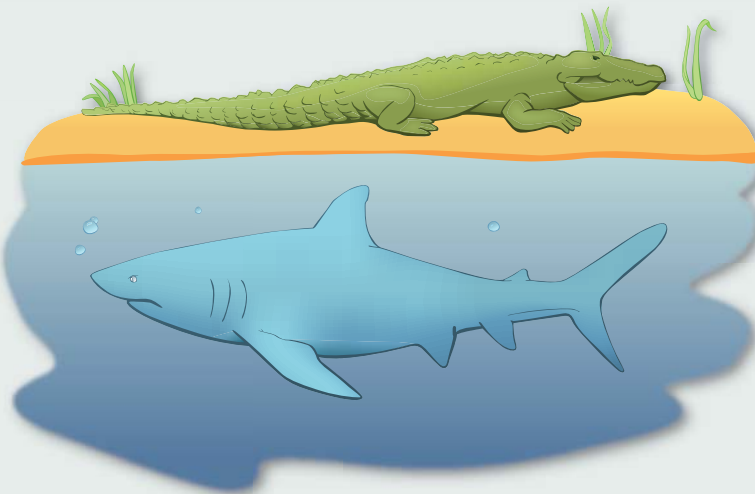

parts of Australia and Asia.

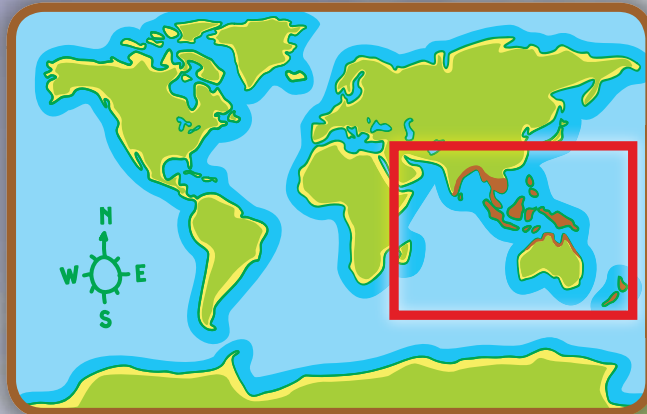
They live in rivers and swamps.
