








Struggling to Survive

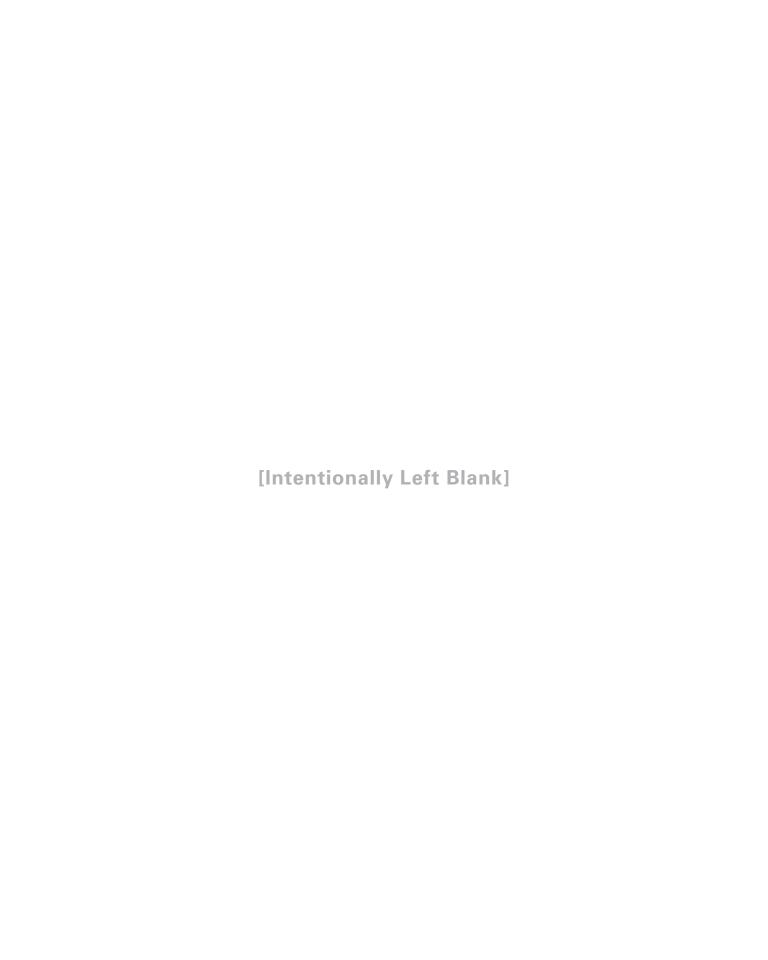
