





One hot summer day in 2011, Debbie left her house to check her mailbox. All of a sudden, Bear blocked her path by moving his body in front of hers. He sensed that she was going to have a seizure. Unaware of what was coming and eager to get her mail, Debbie continued walking. Then the seizure struck. Debbie fell down and banged her head. She lay **unconscious** in front of her house. Could Bear help her?



Some dogs can be trained to know when their owner is about to have a seizure. However, Bear never received any training.

Racing Against Time

As Debbie lay on the ground, Bear ran to get help. Using his large paws, Bear scratched on the front door of each neighbor's home. Luckily, two **animal control officers** finally spotted the dog. As soon as they saw the tag on Bear's collar that identified him as a **service dog**, they knew they had to find his owner. The officers quickly searched the neighborhood until they found Debbie's house. When Bear and the officers arrived, Debbie was awake but dizzy and confused. The officers called an ambulance. Luckily, Debbie recovered quickly from her fall. For his quick action, Bear received the National Hero Dog Award from the SPCA of Los Angeles in 2012. "This just goes to show how amazing shelter dogs can be," said the SPCA's president.


