## A Daring Dive

In July 2013, a team of **paratroopers** glanced out the small windows of an airplane. Each soldier wore a special backpack with a parachute tucked inside. As the plane soared more than 1,000 feet (305 m) in the air, the soldiers lined up near a door in the side of the plane. Each paratrooper waited for his chance to jump out and **skydive** to the ground.

> The paratroopers are members of the Air Force of Colombia, a country in South America. The team is trained to swoop down from the skies to find bombs and battle **terrorists**.

One team member, **Officer** Jorge Herrera, however, was carrying more than just his parachute pack. He also had a furry, four-legged passenger strapped to his chest. Jany, a specially trained **military** dog, was about to leap out of the aircraft with Officer Herrera!



### Parachuting to Work

When the airplane reached the **drop zone**, Officer Herrera leaped out with Jany. The dog had skydived dozens of times before and showed no sign of fear. After **free-falling** for a few seconds, Officer Herrara tugged a **rip cord** to open their parachute. Then the dog and her **handler** safely floated to the ground.

Belgian Malinois, like Jany, are often used by military forces. They are smart, tough, and can smell up to 100 times better than a person!



After landing, Jany quickly got to work. She is trained to use her keen sense of smell to find hidden **explosives** and terrorists carrying bombs or other weapons. Jany's superb skydiving and sniffing skills make her one of the most valued members of the team!
