# Let's Make Vampires!

Let's get ready to make some creepy, toothy vampires! This book shows you how to make the following:



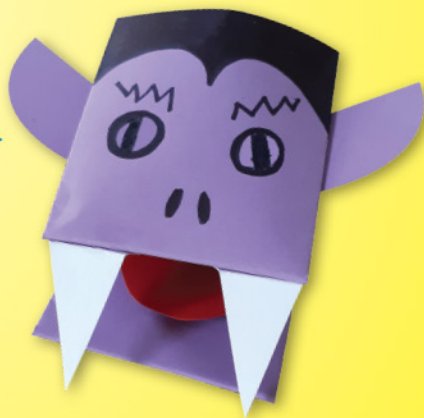
◀ Cute vampire **decorations** made from toilet paper rolls

## Give it a try!

If you've never done something like this before, don't be nervous. Just follow the step-by-step instructions and you'll soon be impressing your friends with the things you can make.

Crafting and baking are fantastic ways to be **creative**!

But you'll enjoy this time much more if you stay safe and follow our top tips for successful creepy crafting.



## Get ready to MAKE!

- Read the instructions carefully before starting. If there's anything you don't understand, ask an adult for help.
- Gather your supplies before you begin.



- Cover your work surface with old newspaper or another protective covering.



- Be careful when using sharp objects.
- When your project is complete, recycle any extra paper, cardboard, or packaging. If you have leftover materials, keep them for a future project.
- Clean up when you've finished working.



## Get ready to BAKE!

- Always wash your hands with soap and hot water before you start baking.
- Make sure your work surface and supplies are clean.



- Carefully read the **recipe** before you begin. If there's a step you don't understand, ask an adult for help.
- Gather all your supplies before you start.
- Carefully measure your **ingredients**. Your baking will be more successful if you use exactly the right amount.



- Ask an adult for help when using the oven.
- Clean up and put things away when you've finished baking.



# Recycled Vampires

According to **legend**, vampires are **supernatural** creatures that never die or grow older. They use their sharp **fangs** to feed on the blood of human victims. These creepy creatures are perfect as Halloween decorations. Make your own toothy vampires from recycled toilet paper rolls.

## YOU WILL NEED

- Empty toilet paper rolls
- Tempera paints
- White construction paper
- Red construction paper
- A paintbrush
- Flexible measuring tape
- Black felt
- Scissors
- Tacky glue
- Googly eyes
- A black marker







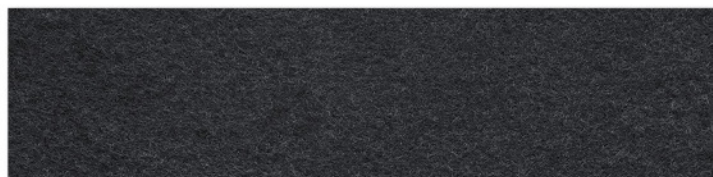
Paint a toilet paper roll purple, green, or blue. Allow the paint to dry.



Wrap the measuring tape around the roll to measure its **circumference**.



To make the vampire's hair, measure and cut out a strip of black felt that's 1 inch (2.5 cm) wide and as long as the roll's circumference.



Measure and cut a second strip the same length that is  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch (1.25 cm) wide. This will be the vampire's cloak collar.
