Troy Glaus knew his team was running out of time. Six more outs and the Angels would lose the 2002 World Series to the San Francisco Giants.


Up in the stands, Angels fans were counting on Troy. Could he get them the hit they needed? Could he bring the runners home and force a Game 7?

Hometown Hitter


