


# **Another Win?**


Joe's passes were perfect spirals spinning toward their targets. As each one was caught, 49ers fans at Super Bowl XXIV (24) stood up and cheered.


What Joe enjoyed most was throwing the ball. He practiced for hours by aiming the ball at an old car tire swinging from a tree.
