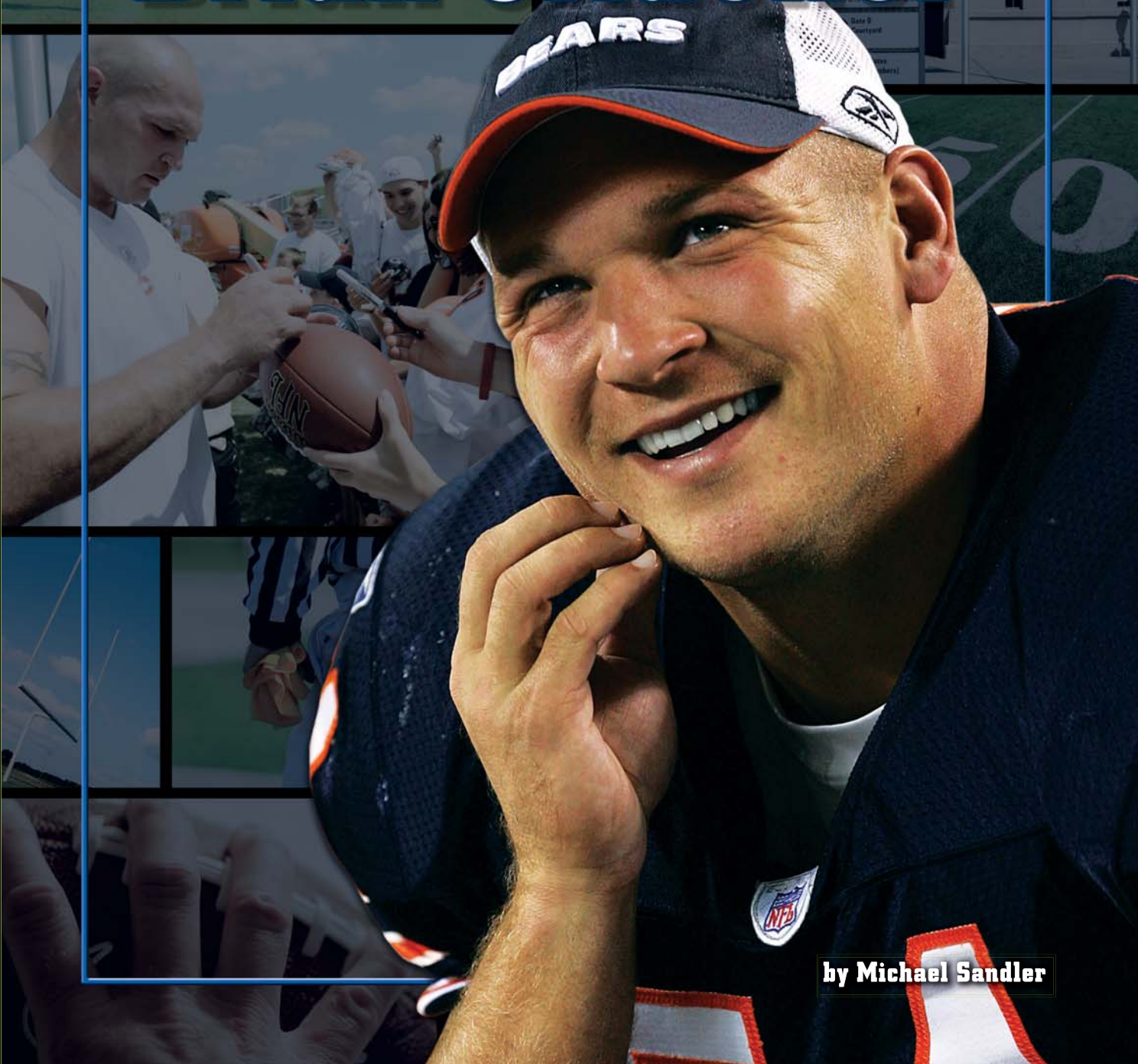

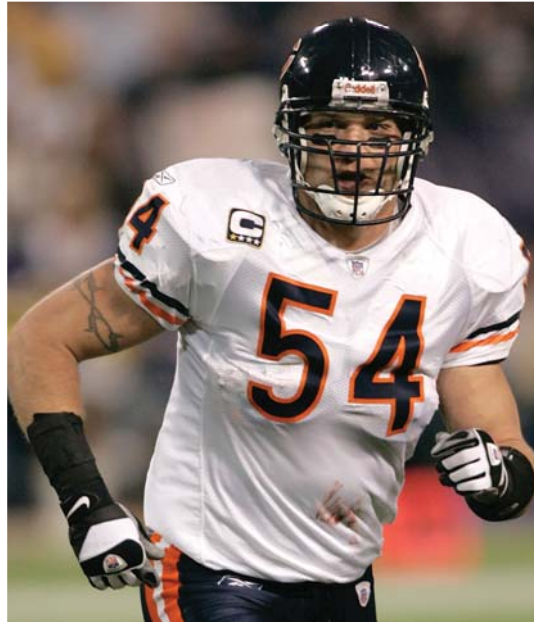

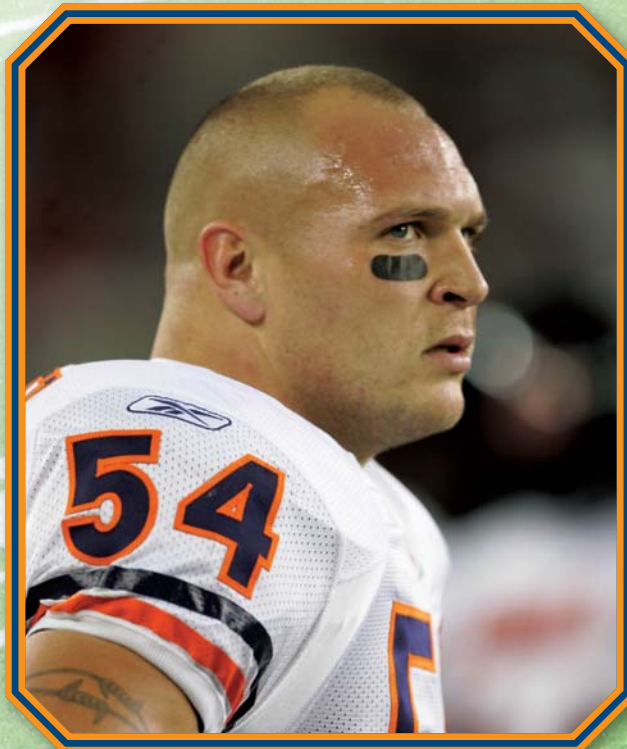
No Time to Lose

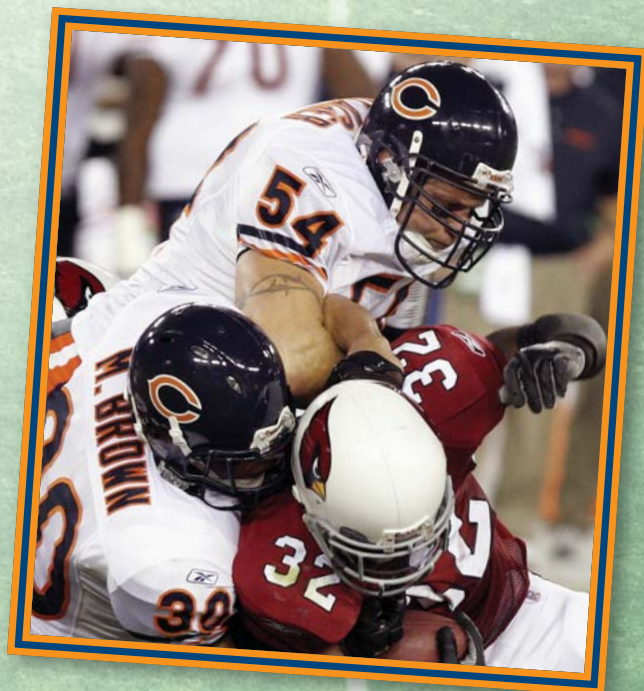
Catching Up

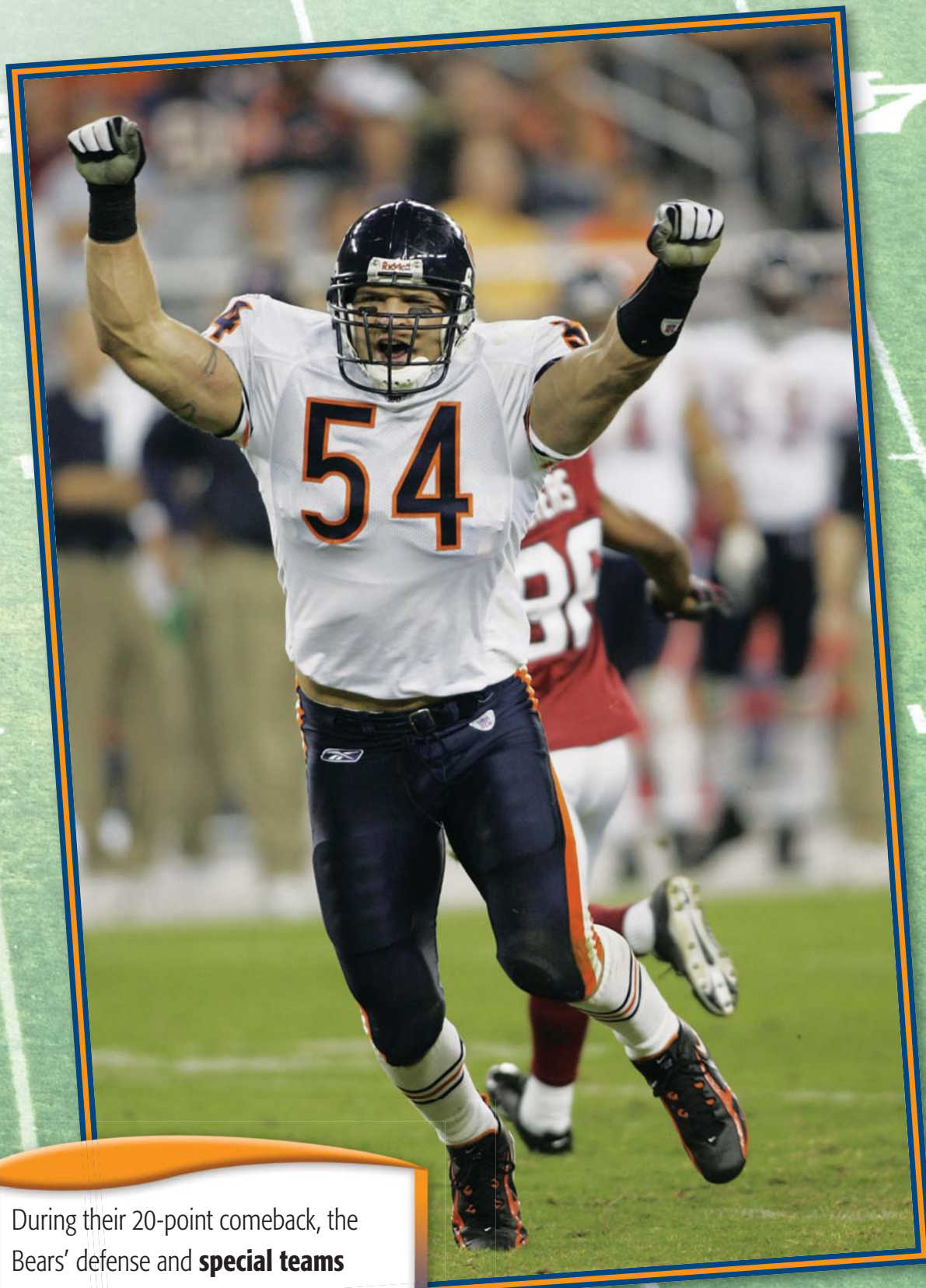
Brian took over the game. He **rushed** the Cardinals' quarterback. He made tackle after tackle. Soon his teammates followed his lead, turning a Cardinals **fumble** into a Chicago touchdown. The score was now 23-10.

Next, Brian ripped the ball loose from Arizona's Edgerrin James. Brian's teammate Charles Tillman scooped it up. He zoomed 40 yards (37 m) for another touchdown. Now it was 23-17.

Then, the Bears' defense forced Arizona to **punt**. Chicago's Devin Hester caught the ball and ran all the way into the **end zone**. Touchdown! Brian and the Bears had an amazing 24-23 win.
