


A Mountain of Fire

In October 2010, scientists made a frightening discovery. Mount Merapi, a powerful **volcano** on the island of Java in Indonesia, was about to **erupt**. Thousands of farmers, villagers, and animals lived within 15 miles (24 km) of the volcano. Soon their homes would not be safe.

The government began making plans to **evacuate** everyone. "This is high **alert**," warned volcano expert Dr. Surono on October 25.




That day, Mount Merapi erupted. Hot gases and **ash** shot 16,400 feet (5,000 m) into the air. People rushed to flee their homes. Many had no time to take their pets and **livestock** with them. Would anyone come rescue the animals?



Land of Volcanoes

Volcanoes such as Mount Merapi have been erupting in Indonesia for thousands of years. In fact, scientists believe that the largest volcanic eruption on Earth happened there about 75,000 years ago. Today, Indonesia has more than 75 active volcanoes, more than any other country in the world.



Indonesia is made up of more than 17,500 islands in Southeast Asia. Mount Merapi is on Java, one of the larger islands.

When one of these volcanoes erupts, the result can be deadly for humans and other animals. For example, hot gas and ash can easily fill the lungs and make it difficult for the victims of the volcano to breathe. When plants that many animals depend on for food are killed by hot **lava** and ash, the animals face starvation.

Mount Merapi erupting in 2006 Though no one knows for sure, scientists believe that volcanoes have erupted in Indonesia more than 1,100 times since the third century A.D. Mount Merapi erupts about every four years.
