

On September 18, 2011, Triple H walked toward the ring and his opponent, CM Punk. The two **rivals** glared at each other. This match was going to be ugly!


Before he got into the ring, Triple H turned to salute the crowd. That's when CM Punk snuck up from behind


Triple H wasn't just


Still the Boss
