

A Giant Grasshopper

The giant weta (WAYT-uh) is the world's biggest grasshopper.



This **insect** can weigh up to 2.5 ounces (7I g), or as much as three mice.



A giant weta can grow up to four inches (10 cm) long. That is about as long as a new crayon.

Island Homes

There are 11 kinds of giant wetas.

These big grasshoppers live on a few islands that are part of New Zealand.

The largest weta of all is the Little Barrier Island giant weta.

It is named for the small island on which it is found.
