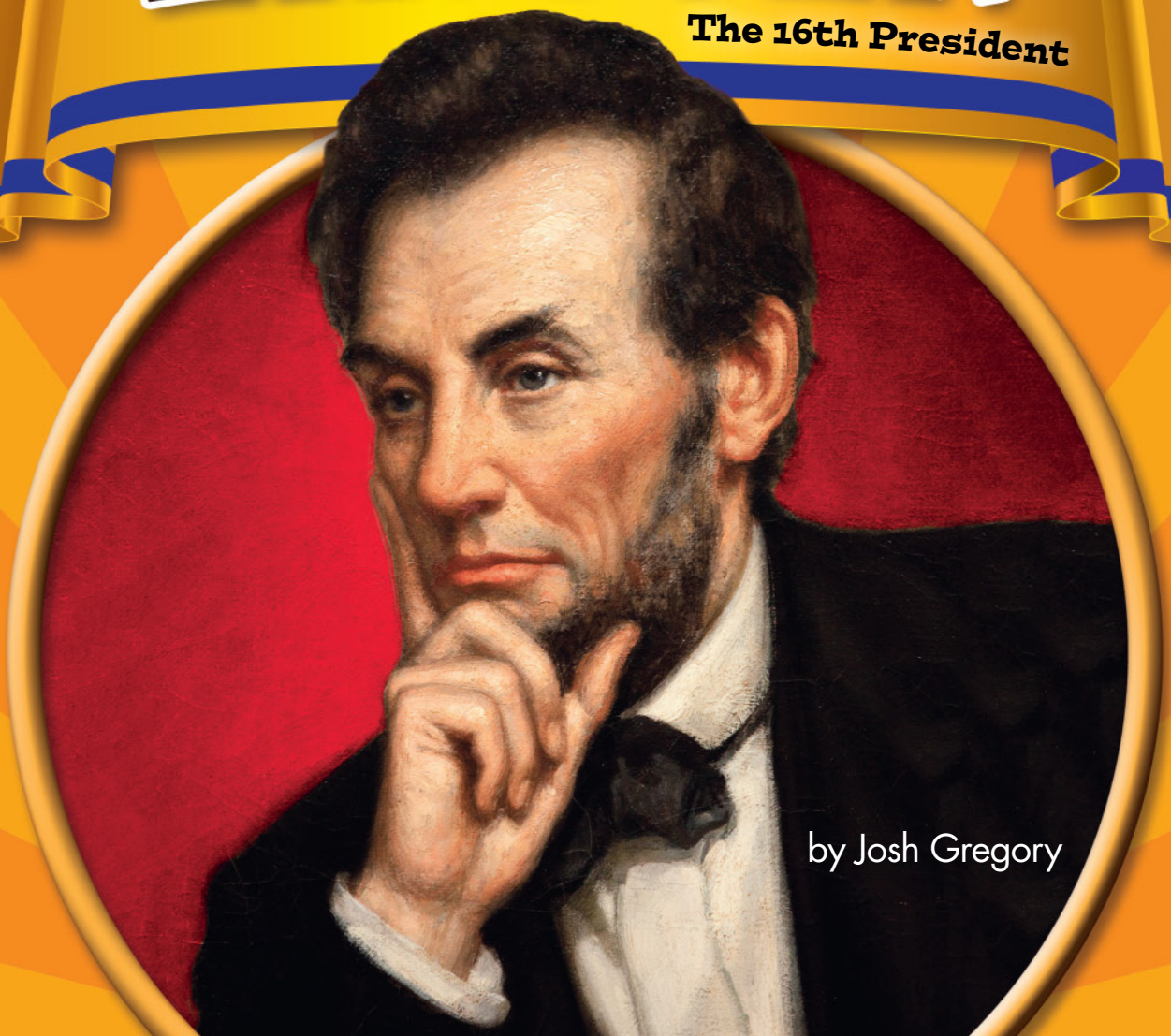

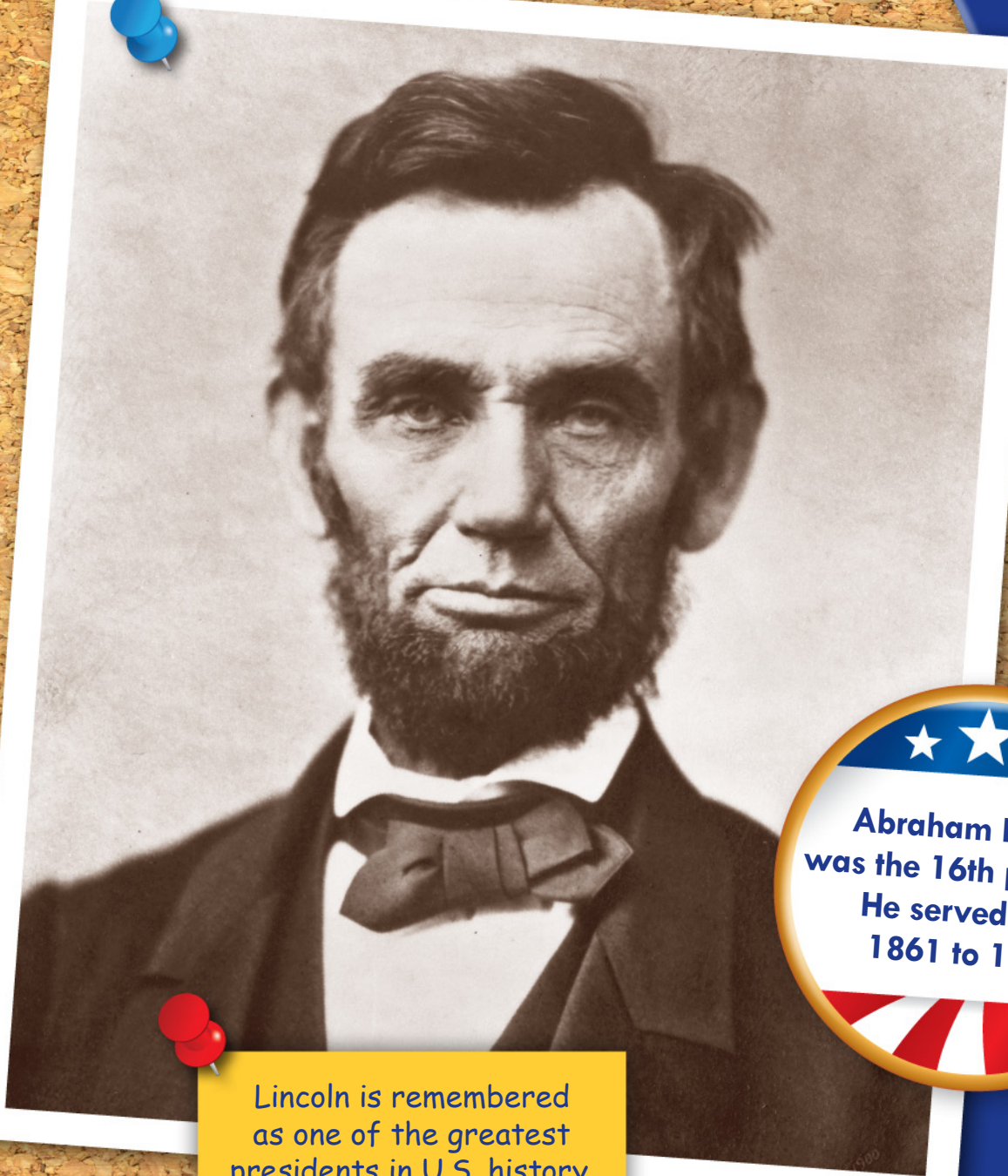

1861 to 1865.


Farm Boy
