
Tom had faced tough moments like this before. In fact, he had led the Patriots to many Super Bowls. However, did Tom still have what it takes to win another Super Bowl championship?

Tom Brady looks for an open teammate during Super Bowl XLIX (49), on February 1, 2015.










Getting Started


