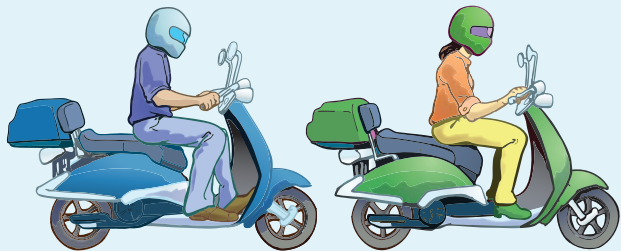

Long and Heavy

The Siberian tiger is the biggest cat in the world.



A Siberian tiger is almost as long as two motor scooters.

A male Siberian tiger can grow up to be 11 feet (3.3 m) long. It can weigh more than 455 pounds (206 kg). Males are larger than females.

Snowy Homes

Siberian tigers live in very cold parts of Russia and China.

They roam through the forests there.

Deep snow often covers the ground, but that doesn't stop these big cats from getting around.

Their large **paws** act like snowshoes, which keep the tigers from sinking into the snow.

Siberian tigers once lived in Siberia, a large area of land in central and eastern Russia, as well as in Northeast China. Today, Siberian tigers are also called Amur tigers because they now mainly live in the cold Amur regions of the Russian Far East.
