That's five times faster than a swimmer in an Olympic race.

The world's
fastest human can
swim at a top speed of
about 5 miles per hour (8 kph).
A gray whale can swim at a top
speed of 10 miles per hour
(16 kph). A California sea
lion can swim faster
than both.

Human 5 mph / 8 kph










California Sea Lion 25 mph / 40 kph




## Seals That Roar
