




A Star

The new film was called *The Wizard of Oz*. Terry would be playing the role of Toto. Little did she know that she was about to become the most famous Cairn terrier of all time!




A movie poster from the film

Back in Time

The Highlands of Scotland are a long way from Hollywood, California, but that's where Terry's **ancestors** got their start. Life in the Highlands was hard in the 1700s. The climate was wet and cold, and the land was rocky. Farmers called **crofters** raised sheep and grew oats. However, there was never enough to eat.


Crofters lived in homes such as this one.





To make matters worse, rats, weasels, and foxes often stole the crofters' food. These wild animals lived in cairns, or rock piles, that dotted the landscape. To survive, the crofters had to figure out a way to control these pests.

To solve this problem, they **bred** small fierce terriers that weighed about 15 pounds (6.8 kg). These brave dogs were the perfect size to squirm through the tiny openings in the cairns and catch their **prey**.
