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What Is a Life Cycle?


A life cycle is the story of how an animal grows and changes.

Chick

After two weeks, chicks hatch from the eggs.

A newly hatched robin chick has no feathers, and it cannot see.

At 14 days old, the chicks leave the nest.
They flutter around and learn to fly.

Young robins try out different foods to discover what is good to eat. They beg their mom and dad for food, too.

A chick lives with its parents until it is about six weeks old.



At one year old, a robin is ready to have chicks of its own.
