How did it get that way?

There are around 100 different kinds of pine trees. The ponderosa pine is one of the biggest.



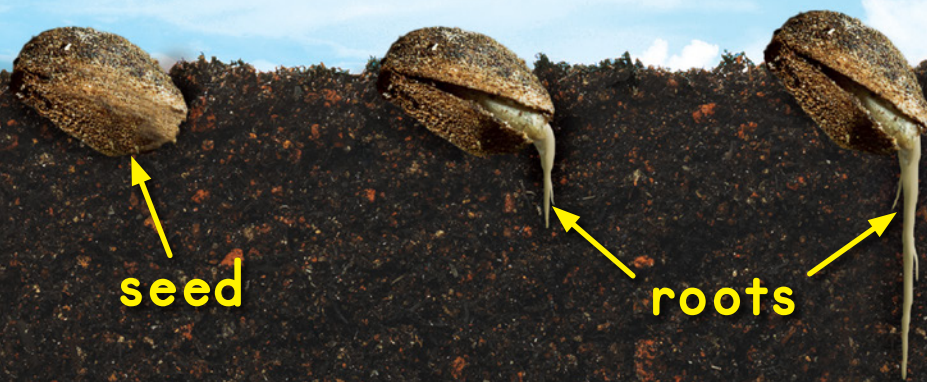
A ponderosa pine tree starts out as a tiny seed.

Some kinds of pine seeds can be eaten. They are called pine nuts.

Water and sunlight help the seed grow.
